- [1] No more than two courses in one discipline may be used to satisfy Flexible Core requirements.
- These are variable topics courses, where each section treats a special topic. Pre-requisite: You must have achieved 60 credits and declared your major.

Integration Courses: LEH 351: Studies in Science and Applied Perspectives, LEH 353: Studies in Arts, LEH 354: Studies in Historical Studies, LEH 355: Studies in Philosophy, Theory & Abstract Thinking (LEH 352: Studies in Literature is NOT a College Option for this Major)

- [3] Two courses (6 Credits) chosen from: ENW 303, ENW 304 or ENW 305.
- [4] One course (3 Credits) chosen from: ENG 304, ENG 305, ENG 312, ENG 338, ENG 339, ENG 340, ENG 341, ENW 301, ENW 302, ENW 306 or ENW 308.
- ^[5] Three or four courses (9-12 Credits) chosen from: ENG 482, ENW 323, ENW 324, ENW 325, ENW 333, ENW 334, ENW 335, ENW 365, ENW 381, ENW 462, ENW 481 or HUM 470.
- [6] We strongly recommend clustering 12- 15 elective credits to obtain a minor or certificate that complements your general and major field of study. The choice of the minor or certificate depends on your interest and should be coordinated with advisors. Education Minors who receive certification as undergraduates may pursue an M.A. in English. Education Minors who do not receive certification as undergraduates may pursue an M.S. in Education. Students interested in becoming teachers should consult the Office of the Dean of Education for the latest information on New York State requirements for teacher certification. The Department of English highly recommends that students complete a minor. Check out more information on Minors or Certificates with your advisor.

NOTE: Writing Intensive Sections: Complete 4 sections designated as writing-intensive - 3 courses prior to earning 60th credit and 1 following. Specific course sections will be designated as writing-intensive and are offered in General Education, major, minor, and elective courses.
