

**Oswaldo Zavala** is an Associate Professor of contemporary Latin American literature at the CUNY Graduate Center and at the College of Staten Island. He specializes in 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> century Mexican narrative. He received a B.A. in Spanish and Communications at the University of Texas at El Paso (1999), a master's degree in Hispanic Literature at the University of Texas at Austin (2002) and a dual doctorate in Hispanic literature at the University of Texas at Austin and in comparative literature at the University of Paris III, Sorbonne Nouvelle (2006). His work has appeared in academic journals and books in México, the U.S., Spain and France, exploring post-national imaginaries, representations of violence and the political at the US-Mexico border, and the radicalization and exhaustion of discourses on modernity in the Latin American narrative of the last two decades.
