FULL-TIME PROGRAM

An intensive program for students whose native language is not English. Our program meets the requirements for international students with F-1 visas. Fall students with F-1 visas must report to the program coordinator by Feb. 7. NOTE: students who complete this full-time program and meet all other academic requirements may be eligible for Lehman undergraduate admission without TOEFL. All students enrolling in the full-time program must be tested for appropriate level placement. See placement test schedule above.

NEW EVENING ESL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT CLASSES: Students can now enroll in a full- or part-time program in the evening.

Each course emphasizes the development of a specific skill, although other related skills are integrated into the course. Students can take from one to four courses (full-time). Attending all sections plus an elective course on Saturday may permit international students to meet F-1 visa requirements. Level of student proficiency is determined by the placement test.
