Danny Bernard Martin is a professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, where his research focuses on understanding mathematical and racial identity development among African-American learners in middle school, high school, and community college contexts. He is also a professor in UIC's Department of Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Science. Martin is the author of *Mathematics Success and Failure Among African American Youth* (Lawrence Erlbaum Associates, 2000) and editor of *Mathematics Teaching, Learning, and Liberation in the Lives of Black Children* (Routledge, 2009).
