**Language requirement:** Students must complete (or test out of) the intermediate Spanish sequence of 6 credits. It is recommended that students get tested and start on the language sequence, if needed, as soon as possible. The testing for the appropriate proficiency level is done by the Department Modern Languages & Literatures (Carman Hall #257).
