Adam Clayton Powell, IV was born and raised in Santurce, Puerto Rico. He comes from a long legacy of public service and civil rights. His mother, Yvette Diago, is the granddaughter of Gonzalo Diago who was Mayor of San Juan in the 1940s. Adam's father, Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., was the legendary Congressman who represented Harlem from 1944 thru 1970. After graduating high school from Academia Sagrado Corazón in Santurce, Puerto Rico, Adam moved to the mainland and graduated from Howard University in 1984 and Fordham Law School in 1988. In 2000, Adam was elected to the NY State Assembly to represent East Harlem and other parts of the Harlem area. For 10 years he brought to the Assembly a progressive voice that would not compromise his beliefs on behalf of the people of this State. During his tenure in the Assembly, he also served as the Chairman of the Angelo Del Toro Puerto Rican/Hispanic Youth Leadership Institute which brings over 150 high school students from across the State for a three-day conference which ends with a mock session in the Assembly chamber and a scholarship dinner.
