38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Championships CCNY BEATS BARUCH, 84-79 IN FINAL

NEW YORK, NY – Second-seeded City College of New York outscored the host and number one seed, Baruch College, by a slim 19-16 margin in the final four minutes to post an 84-79 victory in the Men's Final of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships.

After falling behind 6-4 at the 18:26 mark of the first half, the Beavers went on a 14-3 run over the next five minutes to take an 18-9 advantage. They would not relinquish that lead for the remainder of the game against the host Bearcats.

"This game is a great start for us and we hope to continue it in the NCAA Tournament," said senior guard Dana Warner (New York, NY), who was named CUNY Tournament MVP. The "start" is more like a continuation for the hottest team in the conference as the Beavers have now won 12 of their last 14 games.

"Dana Warner is the strongest guard in CUNY," said CCNY head coach Andy Stampfel. "He is so smart on both ends of the floor. Along with Edwin Caceres playing inside, they form a lethal combination. Basically our two seniors put the entire squad on their backs."

CCNY, which captured its 11th overall CUNY championship, had five players in double figures. Warner paced the Beavers with 24 points, six rebounds, and five assists. Sophomore guard Avain Gourdine (New York, NY) notched 15 points and five assists while senior forward Caceres (Queens, NY) added 13 points along with a game-high 10 rebounds. Rounding out the double-figure scorers were sophomore forward Darryl France (Queens, NY) with 12 points while freshman guard Robert Barker (Brooklyn, NY) added 11 for the Beavers.

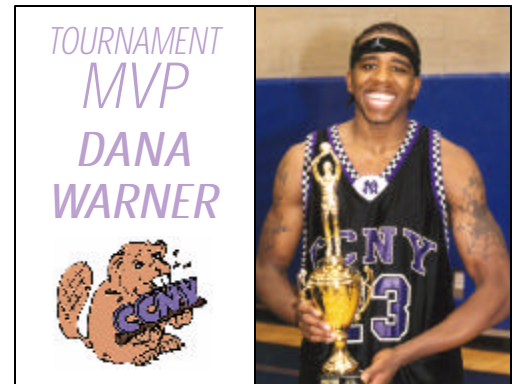
The host Bearcats were led by senior guard John Alesi (Staten Island, NY) with 18 points. Sophomore forward Sime Marnika (Flushing, NY) scored 14 points and grabbed nine boards while junior center Garry Etienne (Jamaica, NY) added 12 points and 15 rebounds in the loss for Baruch.

Besides Warner, Caceres, Alesi and Marnika, Lehman senior guard



Edgar Lugo (Bronx, NY) and York senior guard Jason Daniel (Brooklyn, NY) were named to the All-Tournament team.

The win sent CCNY to the NCAA Championships for the second time in the last three seasons, while Baruch headed off to the ECAC Tournament for the sixth time in seven seasons.

CUNY TOURNAMENT RECAPS

CHAMPIONSHIPS at BARUCH COLLEGE (New York, NY)

Semifinals: #1 Baruch 79, #4 Lehman 75

Two successful free throws by senior Daniel Guilford (Bronx, NY) with 1.9 seconds remaining clinched the victory for the host and number one seed, Baruch College, 79-75 over fourth-seeded Lehman College in the opener of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships men's semifinals.

"Danny is probably our mentally toughest player," said 20th year Baruch head coach Ray Rankis. "I am not surprised by his play at the end of the game as he was able hit those key free throws."

A back-and-forth match-up had the Bearcats leading by a slim margin of 74-73 with 1:13 left in the game. Baruch closed out the encounter with a 5-2 run in the final 60 seconds for the victory and its first berth to the CUNYAC Championship final since 2000.

Senior John Alesi (Staten Island, NY), is the only remaining member from the 2000 CUNYAC Championship squad, led six Bearcats in double-figures as he finished the night with 18 points and also reached the 1,000 career point plateau.

Junior Joe Longobardi (Staten Island, NY) scored 15 points while Guilford and junior Garry Etienne (Jamaica, NY) each added 12 points. Etienne, a 6'6" center, also all players with 12 rebounds.

Rounding out the Bearcats double-digit scorers were sophomores John Burzo (Brooklyn, NY) and Sime Marnika (Flushing, NY) with 10 points apiece.

The Lightning were paced by senior Edgar Lugo (Bronx, NY) with 23 points on 10-of-17 shooting from the field. Sophomore Miguel Jorge (Bronx, NY) was second on the squad in scoring with 21 points while classmate Luis Chavez (Queens, NY) was third with 18. Both Lugo and Chavez led Lehman on the boards with eight.

"This was one of the best games I have seen in CUNY ever," said Rankis. "They matched our intensity every time down the court and we couldn't pull away."

Semifinals: #2 CCNY 79, #6 York 68

Second-seeded City College used a 10-0 run late in the second half to pull away from sixth-seeded York College and earn a 79-68 win in the nightcap of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships men's semifinals.

The win puts the Beavers in the 2003 CUNYAC Finals to face host Baruch College for the crown. This will be the first time in CUNYAC tournament history that the two teams meet for the title. The Beavers also boast their first winning season since 1985.

"Baruch is the only team that defends like us," said head coach CCNY Andy Stampfel, who guided the Beavers to the 2001 CUNYAC title in his first season. "It is going to be a challenge for us mentally to protect the ball and rebound like we will need to in order to be successful."

With the score leveled at 55-55 with 8:56 remaining, City College would score ten straight points to take a 65-55 lead at 5:55 mark and pull away from York for the 79-68 final.

Sophomore Darryl France (Queens, NY) led the Beavers' offense with 19 points, senior Dana Warner (New York, NY) had 18 points, sophomore Avain Gouridine (New York, NY) scored 12, and senior Edwin Caceres (Queens, NY) added 11 and had a game-high 15 rebounds for CCNY.

"Darryl stepped up and had a great game," said Stampfel "He knows most nights that Eddie and Dana do most of the scoring, but he played aggressively on offense and came through."

York was led by senior Jason Daniel (Brooklyn, NY) and sophomore Michael Thompson (Jamaica, NY) as each tallied 13 points, while junior Roberto Tapia (Queens, NY) had 12 points in the loss.

Quarterfinals: #1 Baruch 78, #8 Brooklyn 60

The host and number one seed Baruch College, used a 22-4 second half run to pull away from Brooklyn College, winning 78-60 in the tip-off men's quarterfinal of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships.

The Bearcats, CUNYAC's North Division champions, had five players in double figures, led by sophomore forward Sime Marnika (Flushing, NY) with 13 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Guards John Alesi (Staten Island, NY) and Joe Longobardi (Staten Island, NY) each had 12 points, while freshmen Chris O'Connor (Flushing, NY) and John Burzo (Brooklyn, NY) added 11 points each.

Eighth-seed Brooklyn, which advanced to the quarterfinals with an 84-68 win over ninth-seeded Medgar Evers two days earlier, was led by freshman guard Jeffrey Jean-Baptiste (Brooklyn, NY) with 17 points and seven steals. Senior Aaron Goldstein (Brooklyn, NY) and freshman Nicolai Edlund (Brooklyn, NY) each scored 13 points, while sophomore Jason Fulford (Brooklyn, NY), the team's leading scorer, netted 12 points.

Quarterfinals: #2 CCNY 84, #10 City Tech 64

The hottest team coming into the tournament with a 9-2 mark over its last 11 games, the #2 seed CCNY topped New York City College of Technology, 84-64 to cap off the quarterfinal round of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships at Baruch College.

The Beavers made an early 7-0 run 2:30 into the game for an 11-4 lead, one they would never relinquish. Freshman center Robert Barker (Brooklyn, NY) had four points during the run. Battling a pair of collapsed lungs over the past two years, he ended the game with 13 points and seven rebounds.

"Barker has helped us big time, now that he's healthy," said CCNY senior forward Edwin Caceres, the runner-up for CUNY Player of the Year, who finished with 25 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore forward Darryl France (Queens, NY) added 17 points for CCNY, coached by third-year man Andy Stampfel.

City Tech, the 10th seed, which beat #7 John Jay, 66-61 two days earlier to get into the quarterfinals, was paced by all-star center Shacun Malave (Bronx, NY). The sophomore had 25 points and nine rebounds, finishing a strong season after joining the Yellow Jackets during the holiday break. Junior forward Roger Redhead (Brooklyn, NY) chipped in with 13 points.

Quarterfinals: #6 York 68, #3 Staten Island 57

One year removed from winning the CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championship, the #3 seed College of Staten Island was defeated by York College, 68-57 in the quarterfinals of the 2003 Tournament.

With the win, York advanced to the semifinals for the 15th consecutive year under head coach Ron St. John, every season he has been at the helm of the team from Jamaica, NY.

The sixth-seeded Cardinals were led by their two seniors, Jason Daniel (Brooklyn, NY) with 17 points and Marvin Gray (New York, NY) with 17 rebounds and six blocks.

Sophomore forward Michael Thompson (Jamaica, NY) had 12 points and nine boards while freshman forward Kwesi Liverpool (South Ozone Park, NY) added 12 points as well. Junior guard Roberto Tapia (Queens, NY) had 11 off the bench.

CSI, winner of a record 11 tournament titles, was eliminated in the quarterfinals for the first time since 1997, and only second time since 1992. Sophomore center John Smith (Bayside, NY) had 14 points and 18 rebounds. CUNYAC Player of the Year Michael Stewart (Brooklyn, NY) was held to 10 points before fouling out of the game.

Quarterfinals: #4 Lehman 85, #5 Hunter 74

Lehman College advanced to the semifinals of the 38th Annual CUNYAC / Con Edison Basketball Championships with a thrilling 85-74 win over CUNYAC North Division rival Hunter College in the men's quarterfinals. The game, which featured 10 ties and 17 lead changes advanced Lehman to its first semifinal appearance since 1997.

Lehman senior guard Edgar Lugo (Bronx, NY) led all scorers with 26 points and seven rebounds while sophomore guard Luis Chavez (Queens, NY) had 19 points and seven assists. Chavez, a two-time all-star, drove to the basket with Lehman up by two, 74-72 and converted the free throw after being fouled by Hunter's Donte King (Ozone Park, NY). Chavez had six more points down the stretch to ice it for the Lightning. Sophomore forwards Miguel Jorge (Bronx, NY) and Michael Turner (Bronx, NY) added 13 and 10 points, respectively.

Junior guard Ricardo Reimers (Queens Village, NY) led Hunter with 20 points, while senior forward Lincoln Nelson (Washington, DC) had 14 points, including four three-pointers. Junior guard Lorcan Precious (Westport, CT) had a double-double with 10 points and 10 assists.

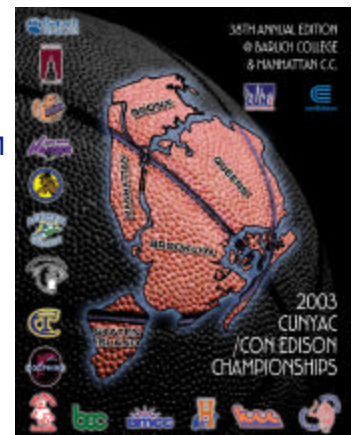

BEARCATS CLINCH FIRST-EVER ECAC CHAMPIONSHIP AT HOME

New York, NY - It was a record season for head coach Ray Rankis, topped off by Baruch College's first-ever ECAC Metro NY/NJ Championship with a 90-87 win over Mount St. Mary College at Baruch's ARC Arena.

With the Bearcats trailing 87-86 and 16 seconds remaining on the clock, junior guard Joe Longobardi nailed a three-pointer on a feed from senior guard John Alesi, who beat the trap up the court to give the host school a victory to end the season for the first time. Alesi, who led the Bearcats with 22 points and six assists earned the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player award. The 6'2" guard from Xaverian High School led Baruch (25-5) in each of the three games, including a career high 28 points in the quarterfinals.

Following Longobardi's three-pointer, sophomore John Burzo picked up a charge on Mount St. Mary's Brendan Twomey, to give the ball back to the Bearcats. Longobardi then hit a free throw with seven seconds left to provide the winning margin.

"The coaches knew that we could go to Joe when we needed him," said Rankis, the 2003 CUNY Coach of the Year. "He's in the best condition of anyone on our team and he's fearless."

Baruch's season began with the opening of the College's ARC Arena in September, providing Rankis, in his 20th season, with his first true home contest ever ... and ended with a school record 25th win.

Sophomore forward Sime Marnika added 19 points and a game-high 15 rebounds while Longobardi finished with 13 points. Junior center Garry Etienne and sophomore forward Chris O'Connor each scored 10 points.

"It's great to end my career on a winning note," said Alesi, a CUNYAC all-star who moved into ninth place on Baruch's all-time scoring list with 1,091 points.

Mount St. Mary (23-8) led at the half, 50-45, but was unable to sustain the pace of the contest despite boasting two 20-point scorers. Twomey, a junior guard, finished with a game-high 27 points, followed by sophomore forward Robert King with 23 points.

Semifinals: Baruch 60, Manhattanville 56

New York, NY - The Bearcats set a school record with their 24th win of the season in a 60-56 defeat of Manhattanville College in the semifinals of the 2003 ECAC Metro NY/NJ Championships. Senior guard John Alesi led four players in double figures with 14 points. Junior Joe Longobardi had 11 points while Garry Etienne and Sime Marnika each chipped in 10 points.

Quarterfinals: Mount St. Mary 86, Staten Island 67

Newburgh, NY - Under first-year head coach Brian Gasper, the Dolphins qualified for the postseason for the 11th consecutive time. That was the good news, but then CSI fell to Mount St. Mary College 86-67. The Dolphins were led by sophomore center John Smith with 19 points and 10 rebounds while CUNYAC Player of the Year Michael Stewart added 16 points and four assists. Senior guard Robert Nguyen had 14 points in his final contest.

Quarterfinals: Baruch 81, Lehman 66

New York, NY - In Baruch's first-ever postseason home game, senior guard John Alesi scored a team season-high 28 points to lead the Bearcats over Lehman 81-66. Junior Garry Etienne had a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds, while freshman John Burzo added 14 points and senior Danny Guilford had 11 points. Lehman was led by sophomore Luis Chavez with 16 points. Classmate Miguel Jorge had 15 points and senior guard Edgar Lugo contributed 13 points and eight rebounds.

2003 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

USMMA TOPS CCNY IN NCAA OPENING ROUND

Kings Point, NY - CCNY fell to the United States Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA) in Kings Point, NY, in a first round NCAA Division III Championship Tournament match-up, 63-57, to finish their season at 17-12 overall. A week earlier, the Beavers beat Baruch College 84-79 to earn CUNYAC's automatic berth to the 2003 National Championships.

The game's momentum swung back and forth proving to be more competitive than their first meeting in January where USMMA defeated CCNY 85-65. Kings Point started the game on an offensive tear but CCNY went on a 15-0 run giving them a 20-11 with 12:33 left in the first half. The next five minutes belonged to the Mariners who went on a 12-2 run regaining the lead holding the Beavers to a four point deficit at the half, with a score of 31-27.

The fast-paced second half saw less scoring runs but numerous lead changes as the differential was never more than six points. With 5:25 left to go, the score was tied at 54-54 but in the next minute, USMMA added three points on a lay-up by junior Mark Medvetz and a free throw by junior Gabe Whitney. CCNY cut the lead to one at 3:40 on two made free throws by senior Edwin Caceres (New York, NY). The Mariners' Josh Buck added two from the line at 2:17 giving them back a three point lead with the score of 59-56. CCNY's sophomore Darryl France (Queens, NY) made one of two free throws and the score was 59-57 with 1:47 left to go.

The Beavers forced a turnover on the Mariners' next trip down the floor but the two teams traded misses from the field. With 36 ticks left and trailing 59-57, CCNY called timeout. As the clock wound down, Mariners' senior Kevin Kreutz forced France to turn the ball over giving possession back to the Mariners. Rookie point guard Paul Tricarico hit four-of-four from the line in the last 19 seconds sealing the 63-57 win.

"It's the NCAA Tournament, it's not just any other game," said CCNY third-year head coach Andy Stampfel. "We knew it was going to be tough."

We had our chances though. Caceres pulled up for a shot on the break to tie, but it came up short. So even with our team's inexperience, we were still in it with 30 seconds left.

Caceres led the Beavers with 14 points and six rebounds, while fellow senior Dana Warner (New York, NY), the 2003 CUNYAC / Con Edison Tournament MVP, was held to 13 points, as was sophomore guard Avain Gourdine (New York, NY). It was Stampfel's second NCAA appearance in three seasons at the helm of the Beavers.

NJAC SENIORS SLIP PAST CUNY SENIORS, 124-122

Upper Montclair, NJ - In the 3rd Annual CUNYAC / NJAC Senior All-Star Challenge, played at Montclair State University, the NJAC men's seniors slipped past the CUNYAC team 124-122, to take a 2-1 series winning for the second straight season.

Edwin Caceres (Queens, NY) of CCNY was chosen as the MVP of the CUNYAC squad after finishing with 17 points and 14 rebounds for the CUNYAC team, which squandered the lead with 7:42 to play in the game. Edgar Lugo (Bronx, NY) of Lehman led all scorers with 25 points as the CUNYAC placed six players in double-figures. Richard Stockton guard Jorge Arroyo posted a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds to grab the Most Valuable Player award for the NJAC Team. Teammate Reginald Wright of New Jersey City University added 15 points and eight rebounds. The NJAC, which won last year's game 115-113 at College of Staten Island, rallied from a nine-point deficit midway through the fourth period.

In the fourth quarter, CUNYAC took 103-94 lead as Lugo buried a three-pointer from the right side, however, the NJAC Team chipped away at the deficit. Kevin Stokes of Ramapo hit a free throw to cut the lead to five and a Stokes layup brought NJAC within 108-104 with 5:22 left. Medgar Evers Rhasheen Perry (Brooklyn, NY) hit a foul shot to restore the lead to five, but the NJAC scored the next 10 points to take the lead for good. Tennyson Whitted of Ramapo hit two free throws to make the score 109-106 and The College of New Jersey's Gyl Vaught sank a three to tie the game. The NJAC then took the lead as Joseph Thomas of Montclair State scored five straight points for a 114-109 lead with 3:30 to play.

CUNYAC would tie the game one last time at 117-117 with 58 seconds left as Caceres scored on a layup. But Thomas hit three foul shots to give the NJAC the lead for good and Arroyo made a fast-break layup for a 122-117 NJAC lead with 25 seconds to go. John Alesi (Staten Island, NY) of Baruch hit an off-balance three with 15 seconds left to make the score 122-120, but Whitted iced the game for the NJAC with two foul shots with 10 seconds left. Caceres scored on a layup at the buzzer for the final margin.

Michael Patrick (Bronx, NY) of Lehman and Dana Warner of CCNY (New York, NY) each had 16 points for the CUNYAC, while Baruch's backcourt tandem of Daniel Guilford (Bronx, NY) and John Alesi (Staten Island, NY) scored 13 and 10 points, respectively. Warner also pulled down 11 rebounds and Lugo grabbed six steals on the evening.

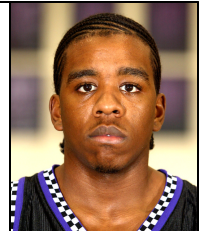
