MEDGAR EVERS MAKES HISTORY WITH TITLE

Ridgewood, NY - Maybe the fifth time is the charm...at least it should be for Medgar Evers. Despite consistently placing among the top teams in CUNYAC, the grand prize has eluded Medgar Evers College...until today. The Cougars came into the 2002 CUNY Athletic Conference / Brine Men's Soccer Championship with savvy, defeating regular season winner and number one seed CCNY 4-0 at the Metropolitan Oval. On the bench for his fifth CUNY final in the past eleven years, head coach Stanley Harmon finally gets to hold the top prize.

"It's a long time coming," said Harmon, who will begin the school's first NCAA Tournament run. "We had the squad this year and there were no letdowns. Once I have all my players together, there aren't many schools that can beat us."

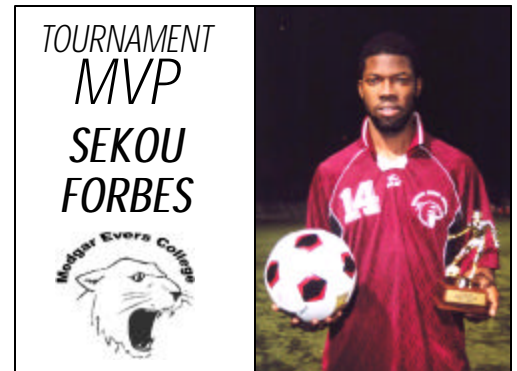
Medgar Evers got on the board quickly, when sophomore Thomas Nelson (Brooklyn, NY) sent a free kick to sophomore Sekou Forbes (Brooklyn, NY) in the second minute. Forbes chested the ball with his back to the net some 18 yards away, turned quickly and side volleyed it into the upper right corner, stunning all present with the lighting quick and awesome goal. The Cougars were far from done. In the 33rd minute, Forbes sent a beautiful cross from the left side to freshman Omar Gordon (Brooklyn, NY), who one-timed the pass into the left corner. Just like that, it was 2-0 Medgar Evers. The Cougars extended the lead to 3-0 when sophomore Jason Dryden (Brooklyn, NY) headed in a corner kick from freshman Noel Watson (Brooklyn, NY) in the 41st minute.

Despite creating chances and playing some attractive offensive soccer, the Beavers never managed to break the ice in this one. CCNY pushed forward from the second minute when they fell behind 1-0 and sent the troops forward in the second half, but to no avail. Even senior Gary Byrne (New York, NY) came out of the backfield to try to stimulate the offense, albeit without success.

The Cougars wrapped up the scoring in the 89th minute when goalkeeper Ancil Steeple (Brooklyn, NY) converted a penalty kick after Dryden was taken down in the box. Steeple also made nine saves to record his fifth shutout of the season.

"We felt very confident after beating Tech in the semifinals," said Harmon about avenging a 3-0 regular season loss. "That confidence will carry into the NCAAs, where we have a great chance to move on and with a little luck we can go far."

Medgar Evers struggled to balance the work and school schedules of its players the entire season but put together a nice winning streak when it counted the most. The Cougars posted four straight wins to wrap up the regular season and enter the CUNYAC Tournament on a roll.

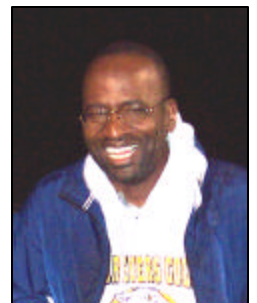

CUNY QUARTERFINAL RECAPS

Quarterfinals: #1 CCNY 2, #9 John Jay 0

New York, NY - The #1 seed in the CUNY Tournament, CCNY, defeated John Jay College 2-0 in the tournament quarterfinals at home. With the victory, CCNY advanced to the semifinals and improved its record to 11-2-1 overall. Durraine McKenzie scored the first goal with 14:28 to go in the first half on an assist by Santiago Helman. Helman scored the second tally on a penalty kick at the 61:14 mark during the second half. "It was a hard fought game by both teams under cold conditions," said head coach Ray D'Argenio. John Jay finished the season at 6-15.

Quarterfinals: #2 Medgar Evers 4, #7 Baruch 3 (OT)

Staten Island, NY - Omar Gordon scored in the 95th minute to lift Medgar Evers College to a 4-3 victory over Baruch in a CUNY Athletic Conference men's soccer quarterfinal match Saturday at the College of Staten Island. The golden goal spoiled a frantic three-goal Baruch comeback in the last nine minutes of regulation time. The Cougars (10-7-1) scored three times in a 13-minute stretch of the first half to seize a commanding lead on a goal by Sekou Forbes and two tallies by Roger Delfosse. Despite the 3-0 deficit, the Bearcats (3-9-1) bounced back with goals by Rachid Chergui and Bogdan Radu (twice) in a nine minute span to close out regulation.

Quarterfinals: #3 City Tech 2, #6 York 1

Ridgewood, NY - In the school's first year of eligibility for the CUNY Tournament, City Tech defeated defending champion York 2-1 in a quarterfinal matchup at the Metropolitan Oval. Raphael Lynch scored a goal in the first half while Richard Franco tallied in the second half for the game-winner, sending the Yellow Jackets (7-6) into the semifinals. Cheik Keita had the only goal for the Cardinals (5-6-1).

Quarterfinals: #5 Hunter 2, #4 Staten Island 0

Staten Island, NY - Satoru Moriwaki scored on a pass from Lee Cohen in the 29th minute and Takuma Sugata nailed a penalty kick in the 82nd minute to lead #5 seed Hunter (6-10) past #4 seed Staten Island (6-8-1) in the CUNYAC Tournament quarterfinals 2-0. Hunter's pressing defense kept 10 men back for most of the game, allowing the Dolphins to take only five shots on goal. Hunter goalkeeper Daniel Djura made five saves for his fourth shutout in five career CUNY Tournament games.

Cougars Fall In NCAA Opener

Babson Park, MA - Coming off of a stunning four-goal shutout in the CUNYAC Championship, Medgar Evers College was held scoreless by Babson College in a first round matchup of the 2002 NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Championship 3-0. The game was played on the campus of the higher seeded Babson through a cold rainstorm and a brisk breeze. Medgar Evers, which earned the school's first-ever NCAA berth in a team sport by winning the CUNY Athletic Conference championship the previous week, ends its season with a record of 12-8-1.



Babson (12-5-5) wasted little time getting on the board as the Beavers struck just 4:54 into the contest. Midfielder Steve Pagnotta's breakaway shot ricocheted off charging Medgar Evers goalie Ancil Steeple (Brooklyn, NY) and caromed out to forward Shaun Dowell, who placed a low shot into a wide-open net to give his team a 1-0 advantage.

The Beavers would add another score just three and a half minutes later, when midfielder Jonah Frisch used a nice move to take the ball deep into Cougars' territory. He then hit a short pass that glanced off a defender and rolled right to Pagnotta, who converted his team's second wide-open look to increase Babson's lead to 2-0.

Despite the early two-goal deficit, Medgar Evers settled down nicely in the second half to record five of its six shots in the stanza. However, Babson goalkeeper Tom Malloy stopped all three shots that he faced on net to keep the Cougars off the board. The Beavers then added an insurance goal with 8:29 remaining as Dowell scored his second of the contest off a cross from midfielder Mark Abraham that capped off the Babson victory.

Malloy finished with three saves in net for Babson while Steeple stopped seven shots in goal for Medgar Evers. CUNY Tournament Most Valuable Player Sekou Forbes (Brooklyn, NY) and all-star Noel Watson (Brooklyn, NY) weren't able to get together for enough combinations on the muddy field to get the Cougars offense going.

"By the time the team settled down, it was too late," said 12th year head coach Stanley Harmon. "Still we played with an experienced team for most of the game. It's an experience these young men will never forget and it provides a starting point for next season."

Semifinals: #1 CCNY 2, #5 Hunter 0

Ridgewood, NY - City College of New York advanced to the CUNYAC Championship for the second consecutive year with a 2-0 victory at the Metropolitan Oval in Ridgewood, Queens. It was the Beavers second straight shutout in the tournament. CCNY, the CUNYAC regular season champion, got on the scoreboard in the 16th minute when defender Kenton Moore sent a diagonal through ball to Douey Wright, who put it over outrushing Hunter keeper Daniel Djura's head for the first tally. The Beavers' second goal came in the 83rd minute when Santiago Helman's shot was deflected by Djura before Wright pounced on the loose ball and put it away for his league-lead-tying 14th goal of the year.

Semifinals: #2 Medgar Evers 4, #3 City Tech 1

Ridgewood, NY - Following a scoreless first half, #2 seed Medgar Evers College exploded for four goals to top New York City College of Technology 4-1 in the semifinals of the CUNYAC Championship. Medgar Evers scored the first goal in the 56th minute when Sekou Forbes scored from a tough angle into the far corner after a throw in from Noel Watson. Nineteen minutes later Watson found a cutting Roger Delfosse, who knocked in the second goal. In the 83rd minute, City Tech scored on a penalty kick after a handball in the box as Noel Escoto slipped one past MEC goalkeeper Ancil Steeple, who had 11 saves. In the 85th minute, Watson earned his third assist of the game when he went wide on the right side and crossed it to a cutting Jason Dryden, who put in a beautiful diving side-volley. Dryden also scored a second time on a breakaway two minutes later to complete the victory.
