DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

Beth J. Lief

WHEREAS, Beth J. Lief is an education visionary and civil rights attorney whose career reflects extraordinary and sustained contributions to education, civil rights, and the advancement of equitable opportunity; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief served as a civil rights attorney whose litigation advanced equity and access for marginalized communities, including her work at the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund (the “LDF”) on its challenge to Mayor Koch’s attempt to close public hospitals and on the 1981 Kansas City School Desegregation Case, and in decades of trailblazing work that has demonstrated her commitment to justice, educational equity, and to the public good; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief served as a National Fellow at the Institute for Learning, where she helped incorporate high-level performance structures in Bronx Community Districts 1 and 2 and served as a site liaison for coordination efforts linking research and practice; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief was Founding President and CEO of New Visions for Public Schools, which she co-founded with Richard I. Beattie in 1989, and is now one of the largest educational nonprofits in New York City, with initiatives in 1,580 schools serving 835,000 students, and national replication, and where she provided the vision for small-scale schools rooted in high expectations, rigorous learning, and leadership development based on the belief that solid principles of learning can overcome low expectations; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief served as executive director of The Carroll and Milton Petrie Foundation, where she led major philanthropic initiatives designed to

improve college access, readiness, and completion for low-income students through partnerships with educational institutions, including City University of New York, and organizations that support innovative programs enabling students to thrive and succeed in college and increase access to high-potential careers upon graduation; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief’s work has had a profound impact on local and national public education, improving pathways for historically underserved students and strengthening the institutions that serve them, and her career embodies the principles at the heart of higher education: a commitment to excellence, human dignity, and expanding access to transformative learning; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Lief’s contributions reflect national impact, transformational contributions to higher education, decades of program development, distinguished public service, and unwavering commitment to the principles that define the mission of an academic institution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Lehman College award Beth J. Lief the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa, at its annual commencement ceremony, subject to approval by the Board of Trustees of The City University of New York.

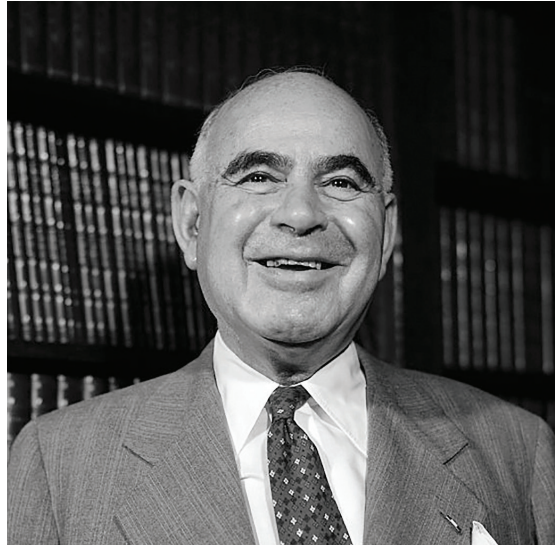

HERBERT H. LEHMAN
GOVERNOR, SENATOR, STATESMAN
1878–1963

Herbert H. Lehman represents the highest standards of honor and integrity in public service.

During four terms as governor of New York State and two terms in the U.S. Senate, he strove to abolish social injustice. He opposed discrimination while supporting reforms that protected union membership and established unemployment insurance. In addition, he began programs for slum clearance and construction of affordable housing. As the first director general of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA), he supervised the largest relief effort in history with the shipment of more than 25 million tons of supplies to refugees of World War II. In doing so, he created the forerunner of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. UNRRA also led to the establishment of UNICEF, UNESCO, WHO, and other social agencies of the world organization.

Lehman College, a perennial national leader in social mobility for students from The Bronx and beyond, was formally dedicated in Governor Lehman's name on March 28, 1969, the 91st anniversary of his birth. Today, Lehman, the Bronx's only senior college of The City University of New York, enrolls more than 13,000 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 140 degree programs; with another 14,000 people taking part in continuing education and certificate programs. Each spring, the College commemorates Governor Lehman's birth and honors his legacy by inviting distinguished guests to deliver the Herbert H. Lehman Memorial Lecture.

Commencement Ceremony Conduct

CUNY Lehman College commencement ceremonies are formal and dignified events. Maintaining decorum and respecting the customs enhance the experience for graduates and their guests. Those who choose to participate must respect the rights of others, including Lehman staff, fellow participants, and invited guests. Students should respect their peers, faculty members, administrators, and guests who have come to witness and participate in the conferring of degrees.

Violations of commencement conduct guidelines may result in a disciplinary referral to the Office of the Dean of Students, potentially delaying the posting of the degree until the matter is satisfactorily resolved. You continue to be a CUNY Lehman College student until your degree is conferred. We kindly remind our students to give special attention to the rules and regulations for maintaining public order during the commencement ceremony. These rules are stated in article 129-a, also known as the Henderson rules, and are essential to ensure that everyone enjoys the event.

The two Code of Conduct rules related to the Henderson rules are listed below for your reference.

1. A member of the academic community shall not intentionally obstruct and/or forcibly prevent others from the exercise of their rights. Nor shall he interfere with the institution's educational processes or facilities, or the rights of those who wish to avail themselves of any of the institution's instructional, personal, administrative, recreational, and community services.
2. Disorderly or indecent conduct on University/college-owned or controlled property is prohibited.

Please note that we request all students to follow certain ceremony etiquette guidelines.

- Decorations are prohibited on the academic gown and hood. Decorations should not interfere with attaching the tassel to the cap. Only the flat top of the black cap may be decorated.
- Words or items diminishing or slandering toward any group, individual or institution, the University, any faculty or staff member, and/or any student are prohibited on graduation caps.
- Graduates are expected to return to their seats after crossing the stage and remain seated until all students have crossed the stage and the stage party has exited.
- Graduates who display signs of being under the influence of controlled substances or alcohol will be removed from the processional and will not participate in the ceremony.
- When it is time for graduates to cross the stage, a staff marshal will signal each row to stand and come forward. Graduates will stand for approximately 15 minutes prior to walking across the stage and returning to their chair.
- After crossing the stage, graduates must return to their chair and remain seated throughout the ceremony. Circumstances permitting, the platform party, faculty, and graduates will participate in a recessional.
- Silly string, beach balls, air horns, and other related items distract from the dignity of the ceremony and are not permitted at the ceremony.
