B. Admission Requirements for Senior College Program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

The course of study in Sociology provides students with the opportunity to gain basic knowledge in the sociological study of human behavior as part of their general liberal arts training, leading to the B.A. degree. The major in Sociology is available in both day and evening classes.

The program in Sociology is designed to

1. meet the academic and pre-professional needs of potential sociologists and teachers;
2. provide training in research methods, data analysis, and computer applications for those interested in pursuing a career in social research; and
3. begin to equip students for virtually any career (e.g., business, government, law, healthcare, etc.), insofar as such a career involves group settings.

Students interested in **early childhood or elementary education** should consult the Early Childhood & Childhood Education adviser for the appropriate course selection in the major. The Department of Sociology, in cooperation with the Department of Middle and High School Education, also offers students the opportunity to prepare for teaching social studies at the secondary level. Students interested in obtaining N.Y.S. Teacher Certification should contact either that Department (Carman Hall, Room B29-A) or the Office of the Dean of Education (Carman Hall, Room B-33, 718-960-4972) for information on the most current certification programs.

Associate Degree graduates of Bronx Community College are exempt from all lower-level Lehman College General Education Degree Requirements.

To earn the Bachelor's Degree at Lehman, Bronx Community College graduates need to complete the courses required for the major / minor, two upper-division interdisciplinary courses, one writing intensive course, and elective courses if needed.

Bronx Community College students will be required to attain a **minimum GPA of 2.0**.

Determination of the 90 Liberal Arts credits required for the baccalaureate degree in accordance with New York State Education Department requirements will be made by Lehman College.

Associate in Arts Degree from Bronx Community College.

Bronx Community College graduates with the Associate Degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences-Sociology Option will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Art in Sociology at Herbert H. Lehman College. In addition, they will be deemed to have met all of Lehman College's lower division requirements at Bronx Community College.

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

Bronx Community College Social Sciences Department Chair and the Lehman Sociology Department Chair, will review implementation of the agreement every five years to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

After transfer into the Lehman Sociology major, the performance of Bronx Community College students will be tracked using the CUNY Institutional Research Data Base. Lehman will inform BCC about the academic progress of transfer students. Additionally, these students will be surveyed after graduation from Lehman to determine educational and occupational experience and success, and Lehman will share this information with BCC.


3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

Notice of articulation will be placed in the respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, websites, and on the CUNY TIPPS website.


Respective transfer and academic advisers will be informed and provided with copies of this agreement.

The Lehman Department of Sociology will coordinate efforts with Lehman's Admissions Office to make certain that materials are sent with recruitment officers for BCC's annual Transfer Day event.


